STEP ONE:


Focus on **community needs** and how the library is best positioned to meet them


CONSIDER: WHAT DO YOU WANT TO DO?

Think of your project FIRST


A WORD ON PARTNERSHIPS AND COLLABORATION


Partners can widen impact and collaboration is a requirement of many grants












LOOK FOR THE RIGHT MATCH
