## DOWNLOAD THE MORE LIBRARIES APP. Find "MORE

*Libraries*" on Google Play or the Apple App Store. The app lists hours, directions and other info about each MORE library. Don't want to use the app? No problem! You can always look our libraries up online. Or call, we love to hear from you.

**PLAN YOUR ADVENTURE.** Most of our libraries are in rural areas that may not have cell coverage, so download your trip information to use offline. Every MORE library has free access to computers and wi-fi. You might want to call ahead to confirm open hours, especially if it's a long drive for you.

Pick up **ITINERARIES** for locally-owned fabric arts businesses, historical museums and other local info when you get your passport. What will you find on your Explore MORE Passport adventure?

# HOW TO BE AN EXPLORER

**1.** Stop by any participating MORE library to pick up your passport, or download your printable passport (pdf). Passports can be stamped from April 24, 2023 until July 15, 2023.

**2.** Visit any MORE library to get your passport stamped. While you're there you could check out an item, participate in a program or activity, or sign in and use a public computer. For Instance, print out a map and directions to the next library you want to visit!

**3.** New this year!

- Cornell Public Library and Chippewa Valley Technical College (CVTC) are our newest MORE libraries!
- Visit up to five non-MORE libraries for one stamp each.


**4.** Can't travel? Call or email a MORE library and ask the librarian for a book or movie recommendation for your secret code.

**5.** Only one stamp or code per patron per library with this exception: visiting one of the following libraries in person gets you two stamps! Bruce Area Library, Rusk County Community Library in Ladysmith, Ogema Public Library, Phillips Public Library, Park Falls Public Library (Price and Rusk counties).

**6.** For every ten stamps or codes you collect, go to a MOREmember library and get an entry form for a chance to win prizes. You may enter up to five times.

**7.** The prize drawing will occur on August 1, 2023. Winners will be notified using the contact information on their entry form. Staff of IFLS Library System and MORE libraries are not eligible to win.
